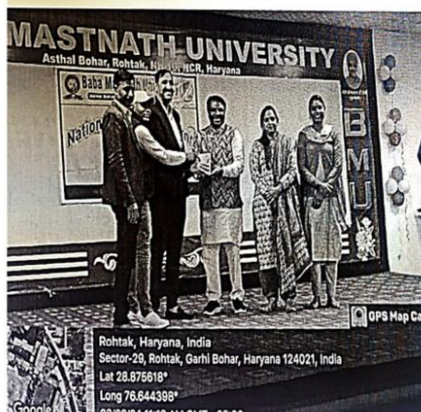
speaker inspired participants to think innovatively and align their efforts with the broader vision of a developed and sustainable India.

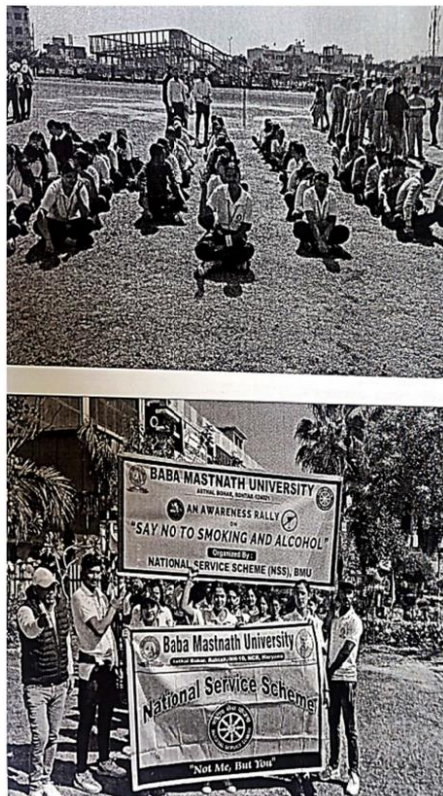
Guest Lecture on “No Smoking and Alcohol: Drugs Awareness”

The program commenced with an opening address by Prof. Dr. Manoj Antil, who emphasized the critical role of educational institutions in addressing the growing concerns related to

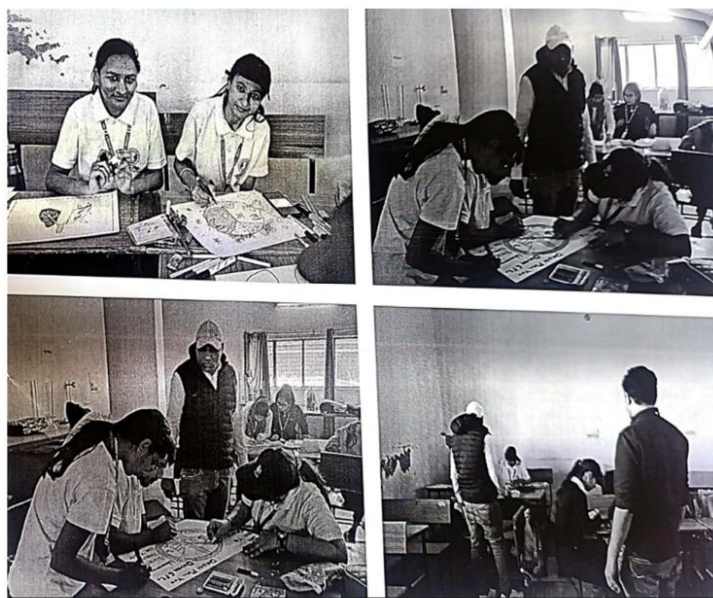

the university's role as a leader in fostering a healthier, more informed, and resilient community.



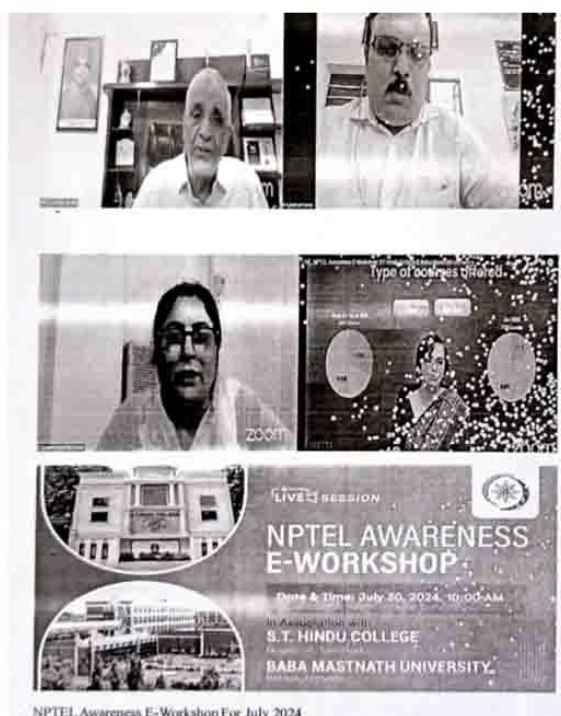
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NPTEL Awareness E-Workshop I

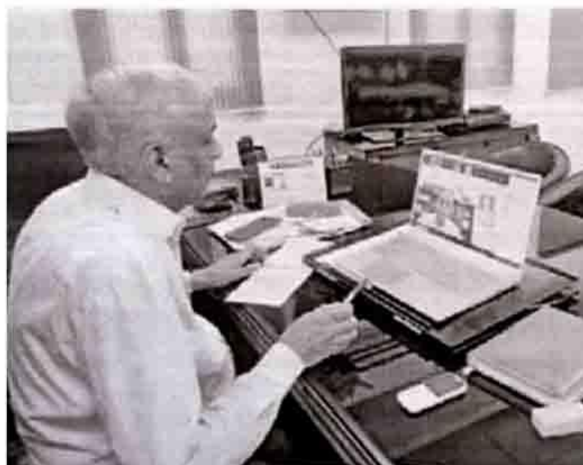

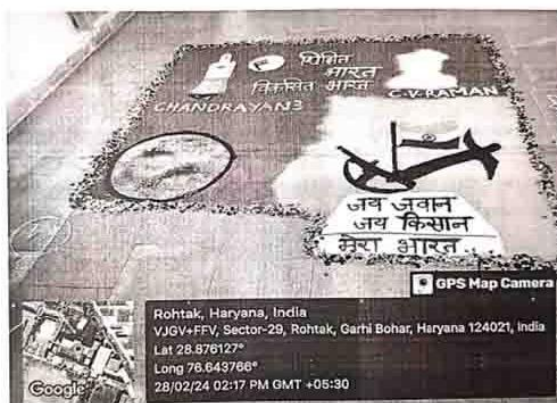

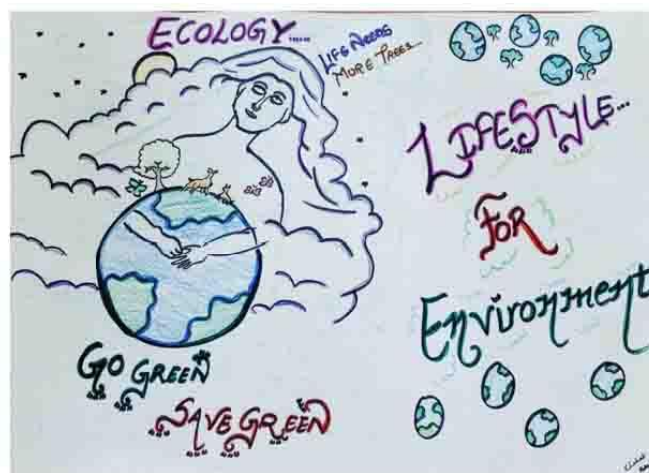
The Poster Making and Rangoli Competition on National Science Day was a meaningful celebration of science and its transformative power in society. By encouraging creativity and

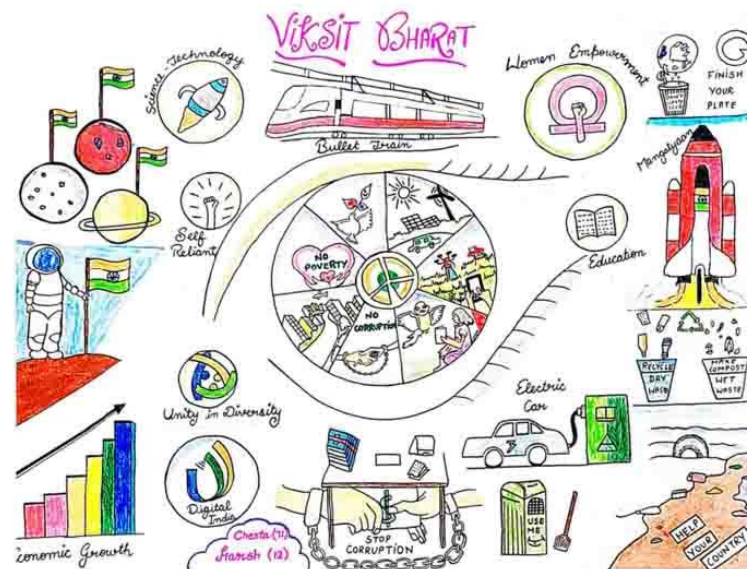

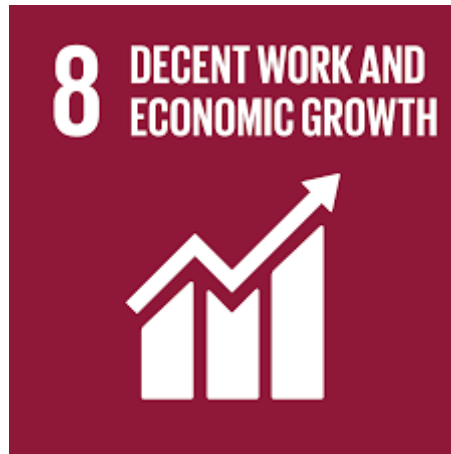

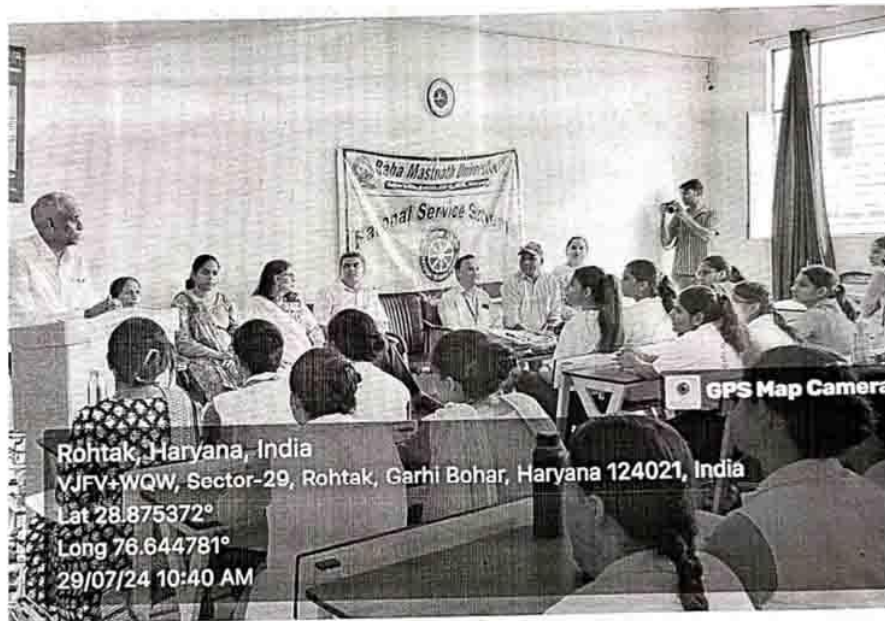

Tree plantation and Cyber Crime Lecture

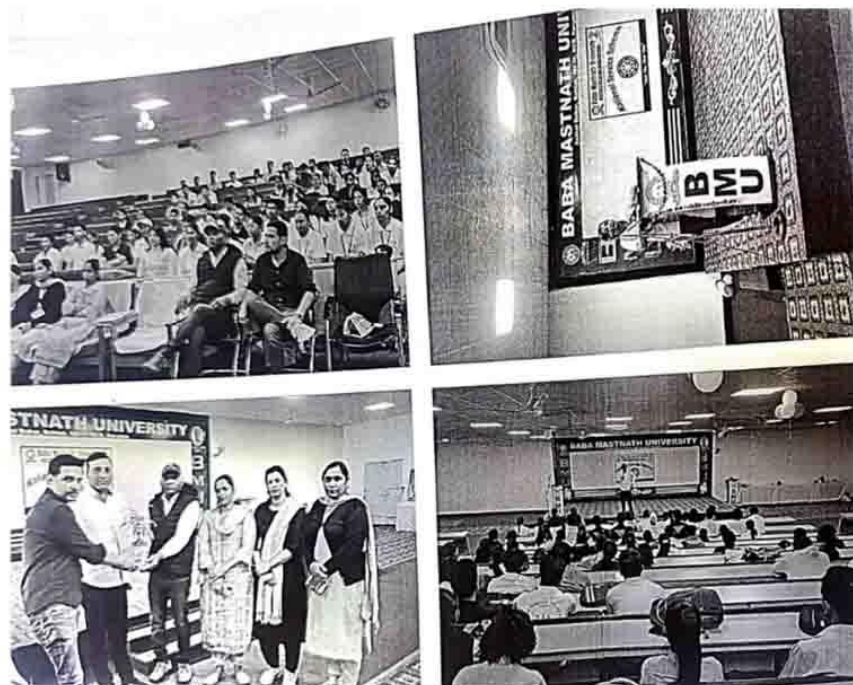
